This is a wonderful family-friendly event, so bring your family and your dog – or your cat if it's up for it, for a walk on a hopefully beautiful day! At the event, you can enjoy food and refreshments for both you and your pet, play games and visit vendor booths. Some of our shelter animals will also be out and about visiting with the participants!

Director's Corner

Giving Your Newly Adopted Pet a Chance to Thrive

Spring is a time of fresh beginnings and for many pets adopted from Paws and Claws, it marks the start of a new chapter in a loving home. While bringing home a rescue pet is an exciting experience, it's important to remember that adjusting to a new environment takes time, patience, and understanding.

Most shelter pets have been let down in one way or another by humans, whether through neglect, abandonment, or abuse. Some have never known a stable home while others have been bounced around, leaving them uncertain about their place in the world. When you adopt, you're making a commitment to give them a second chance, but that doesn't mean the transition will always be easy. They need time, patience and kindness to learn that they are finally safe.

I know this firsthand. My family and I adopted Louis and Murphy, two hard-to-place dogs who spent eight months at the shelter before we decided to bring them home. They originally came to Paws and Claws because they were escape artists — and let me tell you, they have lived up to that reputation! They have gotten away from us more times than I can count, keeping us on constant high alert. On top of that, they've chewed our woodwork, and Murphy isn't exactly a fan of strangers. But despite the challenges, we've worked hard to help them settle in. With the help of doggie daycare, regular exercise, and mind enrichment activities, we've seen incredible progress. We still use caution when new people visit, but Louis and Murphy have become cherished members of our family, and we wouldn't trade them for anything. If you've recently adopted a pet, here are some things that helped us and might help you, too!

Give Them Time to Settle

Moving to a new home can be overwhelming for an animal, especially those coming from a shelter. It's normal for them to be shy, nervous or unsure at first. Give them a quiet space to decompress and let them explore at their own pace. Consistency and routine will help them feel safe.

Establish a Routine

Animals thrive on structure. Regular feeding times, walks and play sessions create a sense of security and help build trust. Keeping their environment calm and predictable, especially in the first few weeks, will ease their transition.

Let Them Set the Pace for Socialization

While you might be eager to introduce your new pet to family, friends and other pets, it's best to take it slow. Allow them to approach new experiences on their own terms. Positive reinforcement such as treats and praise can help them build confidence. If your dog is like Murphy and nervous around strangers, managing introductions carefully will set them up for success.

Training and Enrichment

Basic training not only teaches good manners but also strengthens the bond between you and your pet. Short, reward-based training sessions help establish trust and communication. Enrichment activities like puzzle toys, scent games and interactive play keep their minds active and engaged. For Louis and Murphy, regular exercise and structured activities have been key to channeling their energy and preventing boredom (and fewer chewed-up staircase spindles!).

Provide Veterinary Care and Preventatives

A check-up with your vet soon after adoption ensures your pet is healthy and up to date on vaccinations and preventatives. Regular veterinary care, including flea, tick and heartworm prevention, sets them up for a lifetime of good health.

Adoption is a Commitment

When you chose to bring home a shelter pet, you made a promise to them. The first few weeks or months may not always be easy — there may be accidents, chewed-up furniture or unexpected escape attempts (trust me on that one!). But the effort you put in will be returned ten-fold in love, loyalty and the unbreakable bond you build.

Adopting a pet isn't always easy, but it's always worth it.

Louis and Murphy remind me of that every day. Thank you for opening your heart and home to a rescue pet; your dedication makes all the difference!

Volunteer Spotlight: Hannah Christenson

Hannah Christenson's affinity for animals got an early start. With supportive parents, she fell in love with a horse, some cats and her first dog, Daisey Mae. It was Daisey Mae, purchased for five dollars from Rochester Animal Control, who started her life-long commitment to rescuing and caring for dogs. Daisey Mae soon had company with Rafa, a doggie dumped on her parent's property. From that point forward, Hannah's commitment to animals in need has been unwavering.

Hannah adopted Rory, her first dog from Paws and Claws Humane Society (PCHS), in 2020. Rory was a special dog who needed extra care and love. When he was placed on hospice, Hannah felt honored to have walked him home with a life and a love far different from his beginnings. Hannah recalls the support and concern Tanya, PCHS Shelter Director, shared with her during Rory's final days. After Rory walked over the Rainbow Bridge, Hannah started volunteering at PCHS in 2022 to honor his memory. She thinks of him each time she is at the shelter. Hannah has since adopted two more dogs! She calls them the loves of her life – a sentiment happily approved by her husband!

Hannah finds her work as a physical therapist rewarding, but looks forward most to spending time with her husband, two-year-old daughter and doggies. She says that being at the shelter is often the highlight of her week.

Hannah's favorite part about working with animals is looking in their eyes, sensing their fears and telling them she loves them and soon, a family will love them, too. “They love us unconditionally which is amazing given some of their histories,” according to Hannah. “They can also read our emotions and seem to know what we need, too.”

Training volunteers to work with dogs and visiting schools to educate kids about Paws and Claws complement Hannah's many other volunteer activities. She says she is honored to participate in all facets of the PCHS mission.

Hannah's most memorable dog at PCHS was Zoey (2022), a young pit bull terrier. Zoey bounced from home

back to the shelter for about a year given her “quirks.” Tony Luna spent time training Hannah as a “purple” dog volunteer with Zoey. Zoey was so fearful when she first came to the shelter, but she is now flourishing in a wonderful home. Hannah learned so much about working with dogs while working with Zoey and is still excited to see the updates Zoey's family posts.

Hannah would adopt more dogs if she could. Right now, she and her family are caring for Finn, a Wheaten Terrier, age 10; Scottie, a Japanese Chin mix adopted in 2022; and Nelly, a Boston Terrier adopted in 2024.

Hannah has a philosophy, “Some dogs come into your life at a specific time for a reason.” She is especially grateful for Nelly, a sweet dog she adopted just before her dad was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. “Nelly has been such a comfort to me. I believe that dogs can provide healing for all of us.”

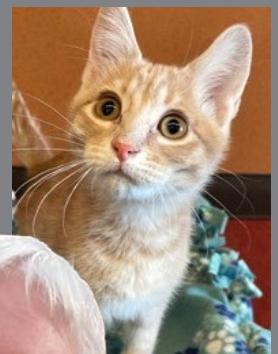

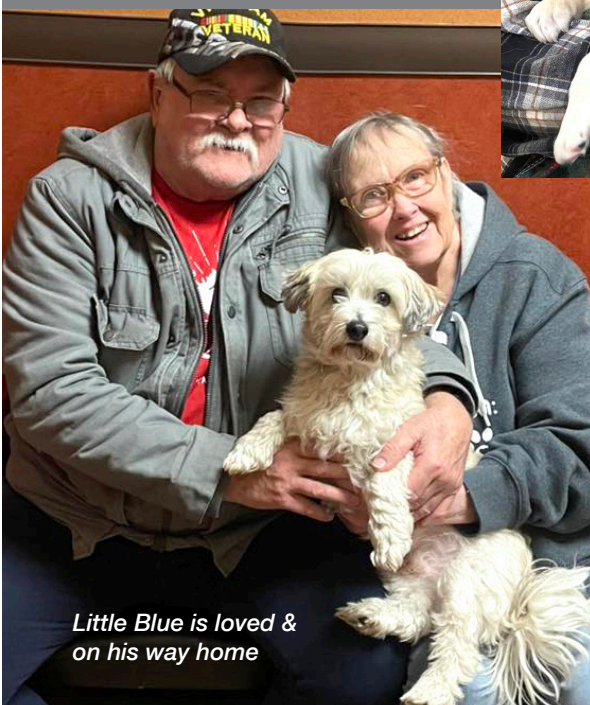

Don't let allergies make your pet sick

FOOD • FLEAS • ENVIRONMENT • POLLEN • MOLD • DUST

It's finally spring!! You and your best four-legged buddy are headed out for a walk. The trees are leafing out, the grass is turning green and the first spring flowers are blooming. It's a glorious walk and when you return home, you both settle in on the couch for a quick nap. That nap never happens because suddenly your buddy starts scratching his ears repeatedly or obsessively licking his paws. That behavior continues well into the evening and now your buddy has sore, infected ears or raw, red paw pads. He might even be sneezing and wheezing as well.

What's going on? The most likely suspect is allergies.

Dogs and cats can have allergies to fleas, food and environmental issues like pollen, mold, dust and other airborne particles. Your buddy in the scenario above most likely has an environmental allergy known as atopic dermatitis. This is like hay fever and asthma in humans except that in humans, we usually aren't scratching our ears! Environmental allergies are often seasonal, but they can last the entire year. For some environmental allergies, the first hard frost in the fall makes life much easier for your pet . . . and you, too!

Flea allergy dermatitis (FAD) is the most common allergy for dogs in the United States, according to an article published by Virginia Tech entitled "*Allergies in Dogs and Cats Are Nothing to Sneeze At*," by Sarah Boudreau. This reaction is your pet's response to a protein in flea saliva and usually results in itchiness, fur loss and crusty or weepy skin. FAD can affect cats as well and often results from just one of two flea bites.

(If you've ever experienced a flea bite, you know how maddening that itch can be.) Given Minnesota winters, the hope might be that fleas would all be "flash-frozen." But that's not the case. While adult fleas do perish in lower temperatures, they can survive quite nicely on your pet's warm body or in your warm house. That's why it's so important to make sure your four-legged buddies have flea and tick protection year-round.

Food allergies, too, can affect dogs and cats. Similar to environmental and flea allergies, food allergy symptoms result from your pet's immune system reacting to a specific allergen, in this case a protein or food chemical. Cats can be allergic to fish, beef and chicken. Dog allergies expand that list to also include eggs, dairy and wheat. Skin irritation can occur with these allergies, too, but so can vomiting and diarrhea. Although rare, food allergies can be life threatening for dogs and cats.

What's the best way to protect your pet from the discomfort, debilitation and downright danger some allergens can cause? Your veterinarian is your most essential ally. He or she can perform the necessary diagnostic tests and recommend medications, life-style changes or dietary modifications that will lead toward your pet's return to good health and comfort. Likewise, you are his or her most essential ally in the diagnosis and treatment phases. No one knows your pet as you do. When the itching is constant, the licking incessant and the loose stools too frequent, you'll know it's time for you and your pet to see your veterinarian. Not only will your pet feel wonderful relief from pesky allergy symptoms, but you just might be able to finish that nap as well!

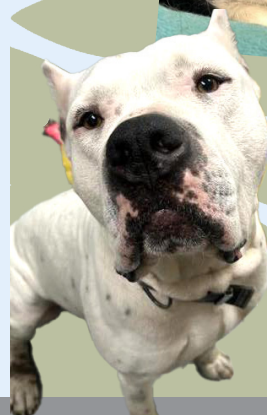
